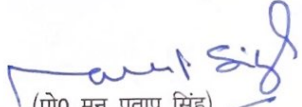

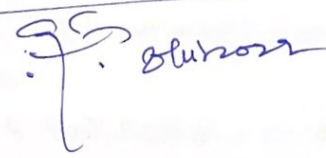

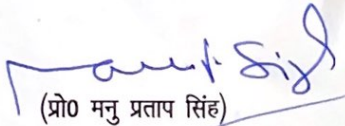
बैठक में फीडबैक फार्म भरवाये जाने हेतु निम्नलिखित सुझाव/निर्णय लिये गये है:-

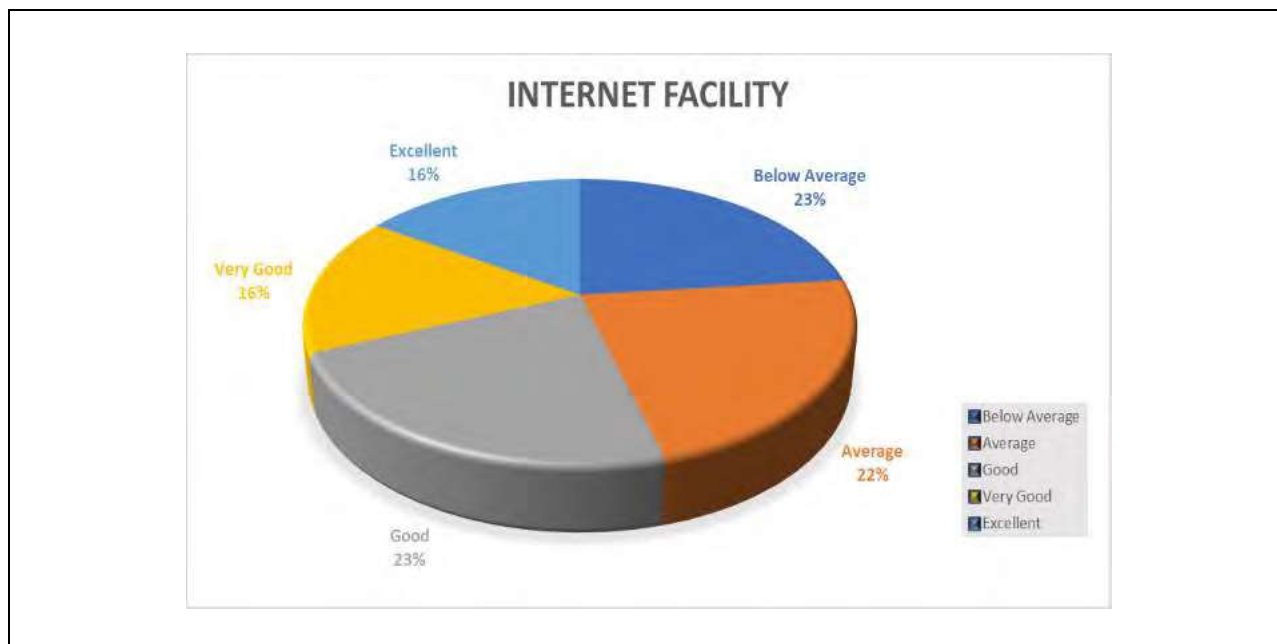

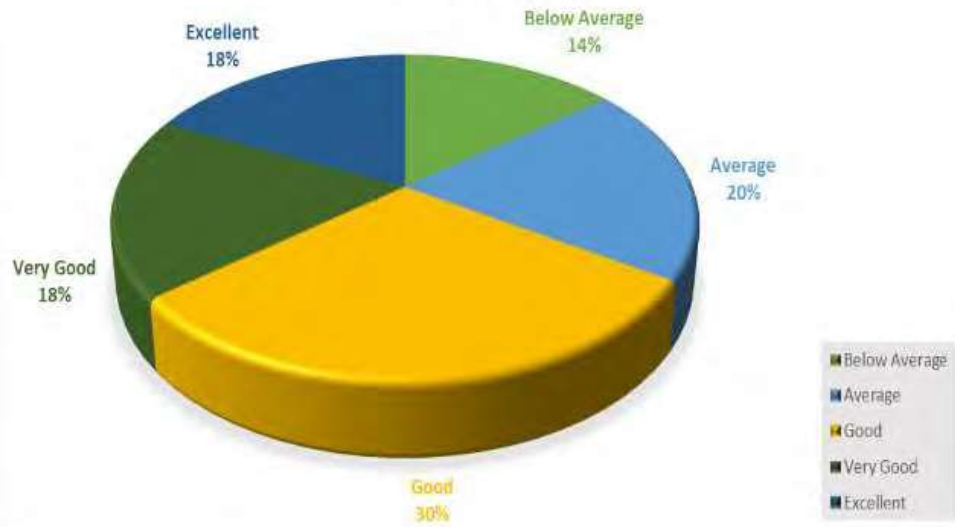

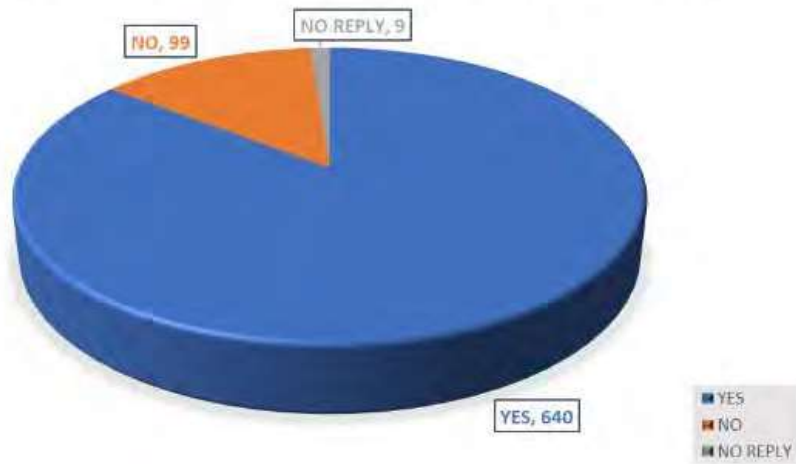
GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION OF STUDENT DATA



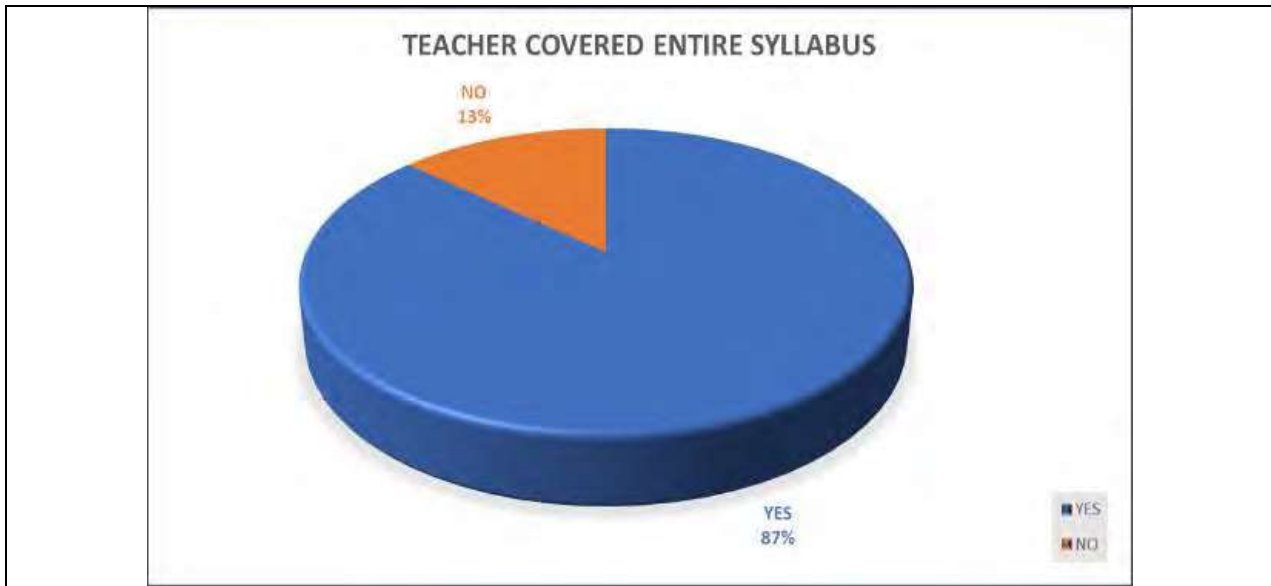
LIBRARY FACILITY



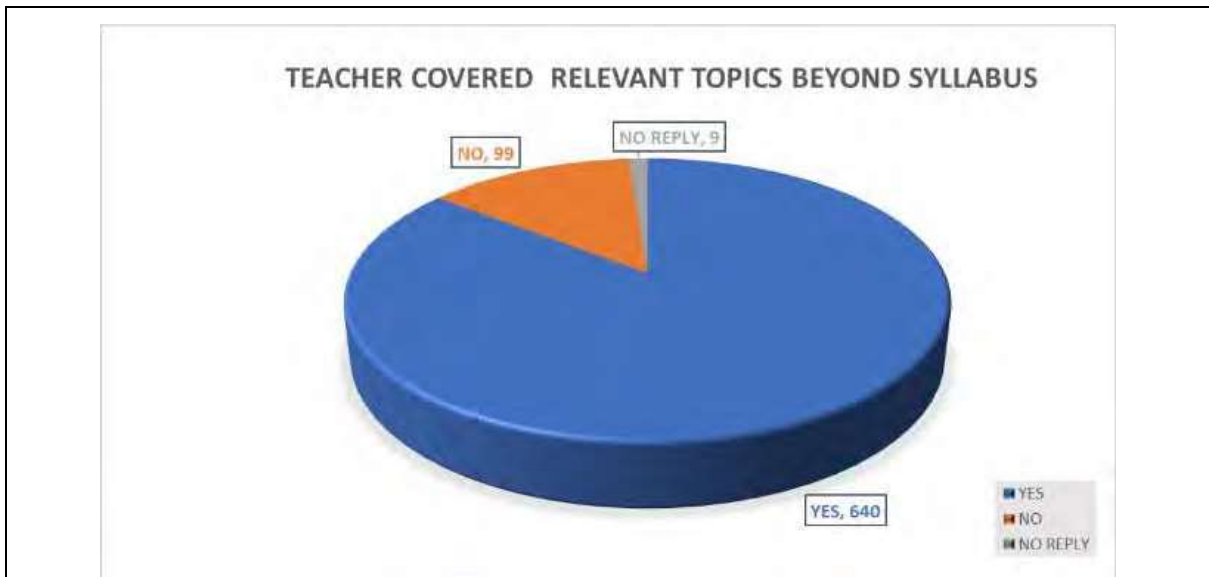
TEACHER COVERED RELEVANT TOPICS BEYOND SYLLABUS




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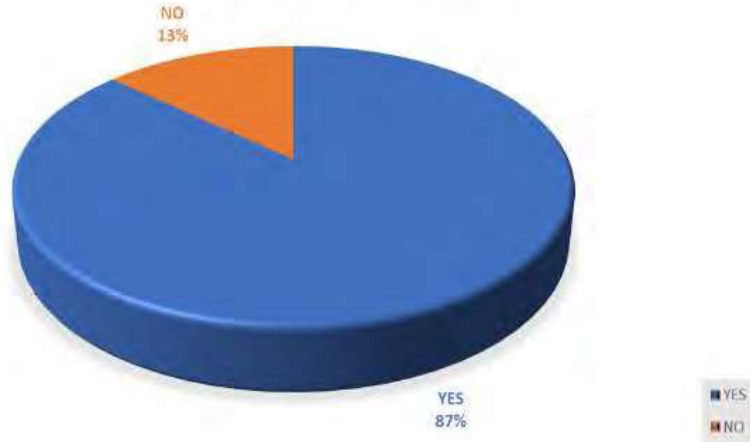

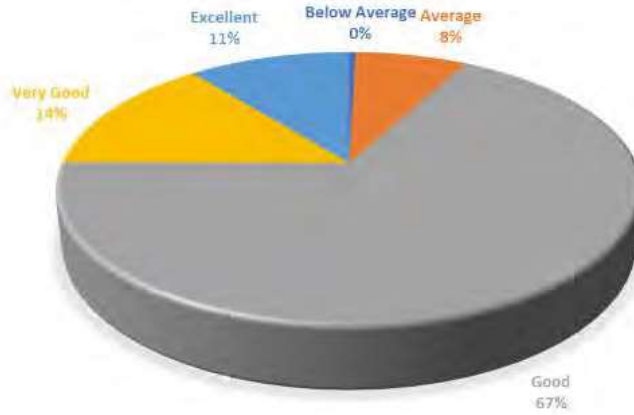



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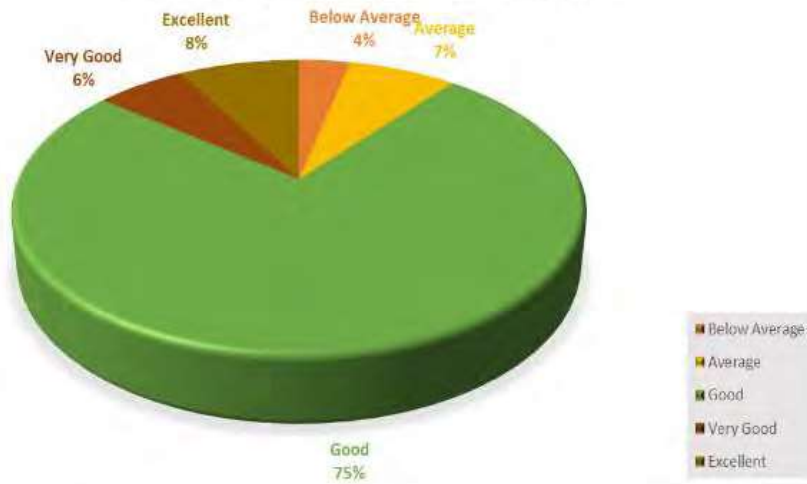
TEACHER COVERED ENTIRE SYLLABUS

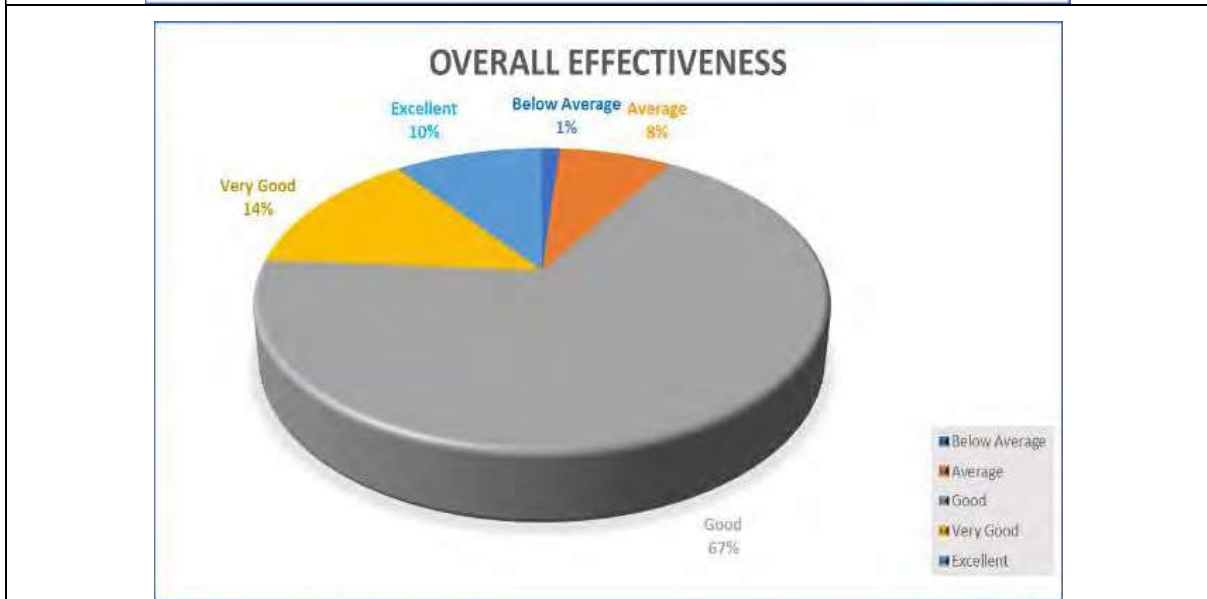
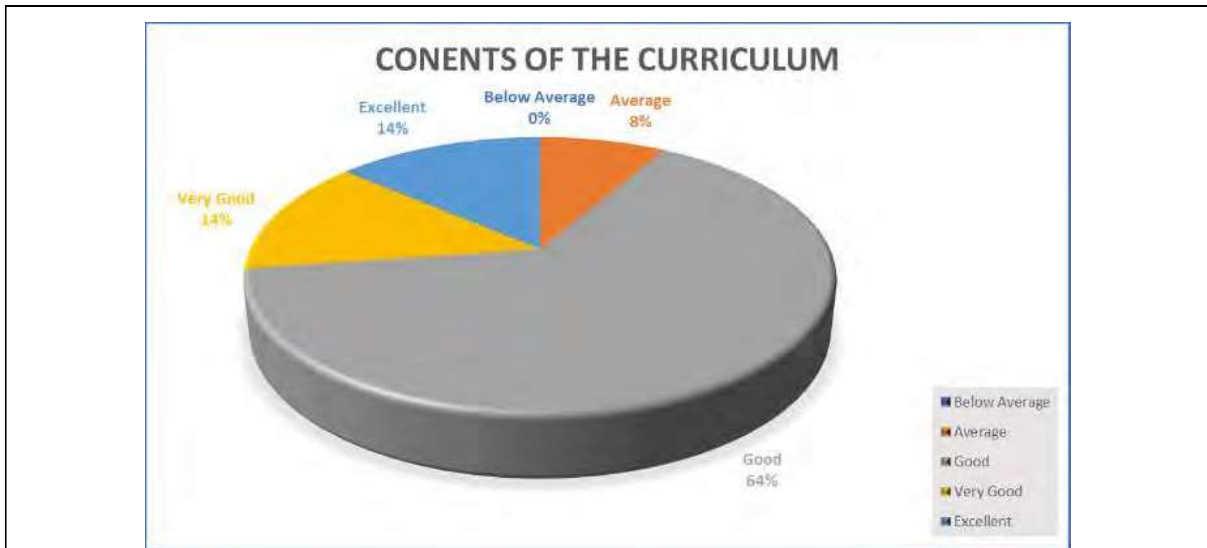


COMMUNICATION SKILLS OF TEACHER

General Action Plan after data collection and analysis

On all these parameters most of the students graded “Excellent, “Very Good” or “Good” as shown above in the Pie charts. However, the students requested the following additional recommendations as remarks in Google Forms: -

S.N	FEEDBACK	ACTION TAKEN
1	More practical training sessions are desired by the students	Formal instructions were circulated to all constituent departments through competent authority for addressing the issue of increasing practical training sessions. The syllabus has been also revised as per the current requirements.
2	Students emphasized more industry visits based on the courses	Formal instructions were circulated to all the departments for addressing the issue of organizing more industry visits periodically based on the courses conducted. The internship has been made mandatory and the part of the course curriculum.
3	Giving more emphasis on hands-on training Project-based learning was introduced in the newly revamped curriculum	Giving more emphasis on hands-on training Project-based learning was introduced in the new revamped curriculum
4	Introduction of Foreign Language Courses	Foreign Language Courses especially French Language, and German Language are being offered currently. More courses will be added. Various MoUs have been signed with foreign universities concerning the same.
5	Promoting Skill-based courses as per the UGC CBCS model, Skill Enhancement Courses have been incorporated in the new curriculum	Promoting Skill based courses as per UGC CBCS model, Skill Enhancement Courses have been incorporated into new curriculum. The University also adopted Credit Based System concerning the same.
6	Strengthening of extracurricular activities	Formal instructions were circulated to all the constituent colleges through competent authority to ensure the conduct of interdepartmental arts and sports competitions. The University adopted New Education Policy (NEP) and introduced vocational and skill development courses for the students.

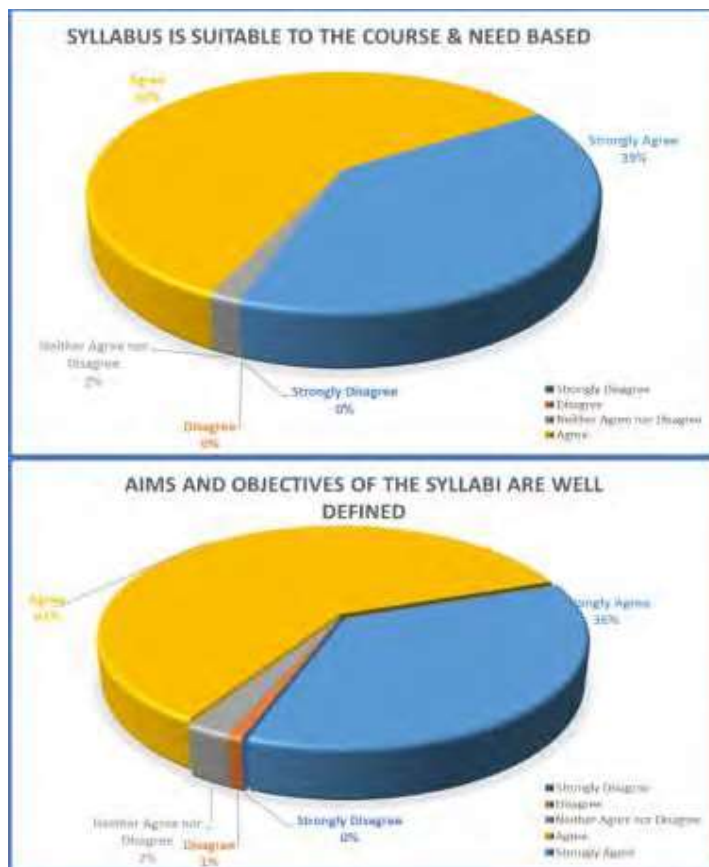

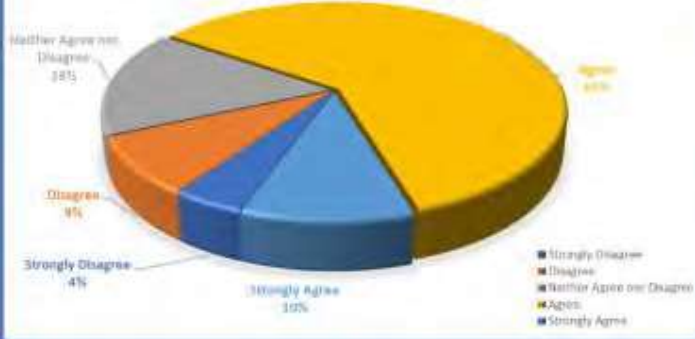

GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION OF TEACHERS' DATA

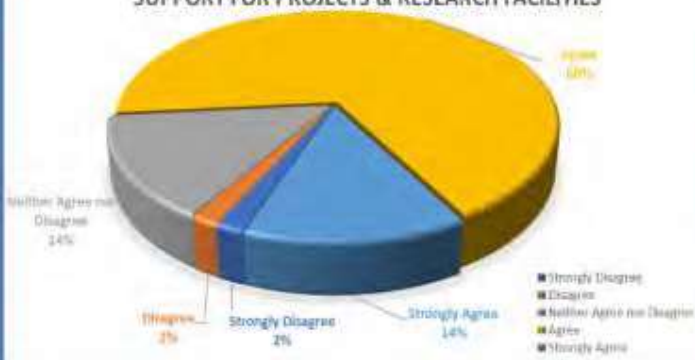



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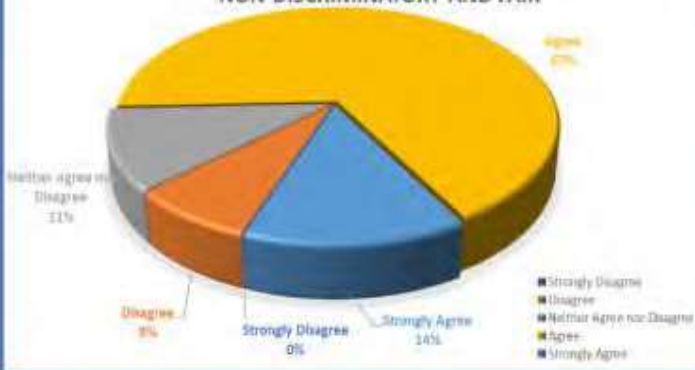
SUFFICIENT NUMBER OF PRESCRIBED BOOKS ARE AVAILABLE IN THE LIBRARY



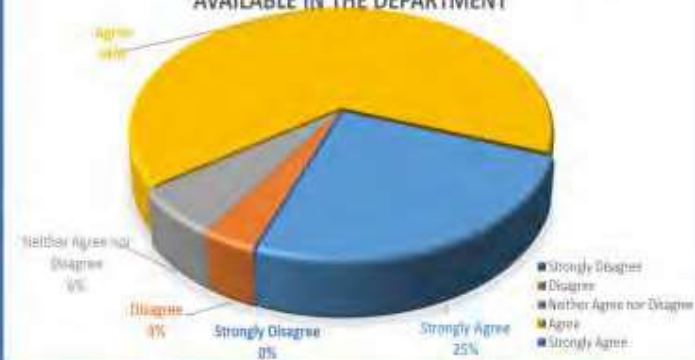

S.N	FEEDBACK	ACTION TAKEN
1	Suggestions to include emerging research and practical application needs in the syllabus	Formal instructions were circulated to all constituent colleges through competent authority for addressing the issues suggested by the teachers through feedback. To strengthen this part, the University has applied for CoE. The various departments have implemented them successfully.
2	Suggestions for teacher training for greater use of ICT in the teaching-learning process	Formal instructions were circulated to all constituent colleges through competent authority for organizing small workshops for the effective use of ICT by teachers. The University provided smart room facilities to students in each department.


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3	Introduction of courses on employability	Due weightage has been given for employability courses.
4	Research activity be promoted and integrated into the teaching-learning process	Research has been emphasized appropriately. The teachers were provided seed money, reimbursement of fees of research and conference papers, TA and DA etc.
5	Participation of the students in live projects, debates, and workshops be appreciated appropriately	Modus operandi has been framed and implemented to support students' participation in debates, and workshops.
6	Current-day industry demands be considered in the curriculum	Industry-oriented courses have been incorporated. Industry experts have been included as BoS members.
7	Entrepreneur ability of the students be encouraged	Innovation, Incubation, and Entrepreneurship have been promoted in a structured manner. Appropriate weightage has been given in the revamped curriculum. The university has its own incubation center for promoting such activities.
8	Offering Interdisciplinary courses is encouraged	Interdisciplinary has been adopted through Open Elective Courses and minor/major paper selection.

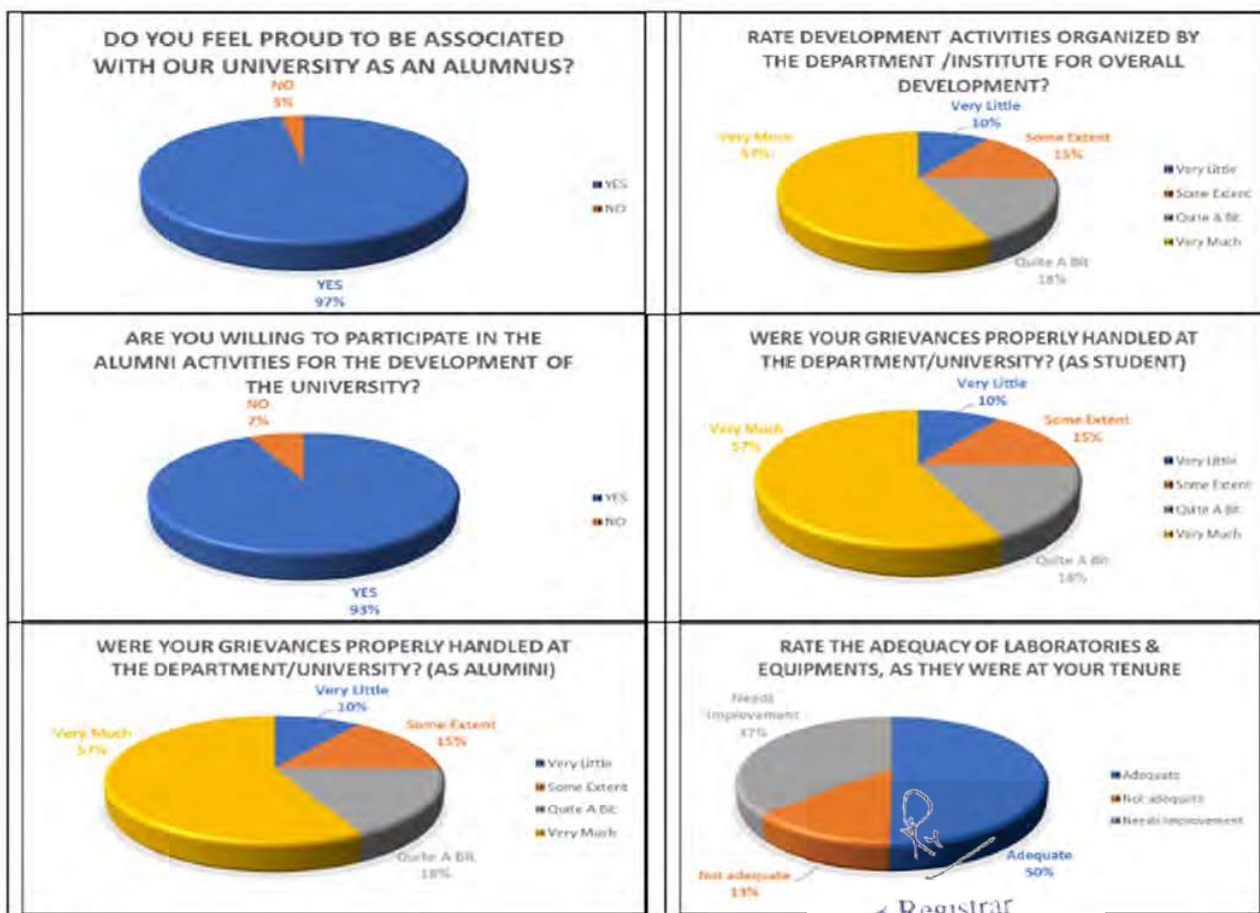

S.N	FEEDBACK	ACTION TAKEN
1	Implementation of a balanced curriculum which should have focus on skilling, application, and social implication.	The revised curriculum has a focus on skilling and real field application. A course on Human Values has also been added.
2	Learning outcomes be predefined	University adopted Outcome Based Education (OBE) across all the programs.
3	Suggested development of leadership skills	Student councils have been developed in all departments to promote leadership skills among students.
4	Suggestions to give more training for competitive exams	Free gate and employability classes were provided to the students.
5	Suggestions to start new innovative fellowship courses	The University has research and start-up policies to promote fellowship for students and faculty. Besides this, a consultancy policy is also there for teachers of the university.

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6	Suggestions to strengthen communication skills	instructions were given and made them participate in academic-related programs that helped them improve their communication skill. Language and communication labs have been inaugurated successfully.

GENERAL ACTION PLAN AFTER DATA COLLECTION AND ANALYSIS:

The response of the employers was highly positive and they graded with high rank as shown in the pie charts mentioned above. However, Employers have made some recommendations as mentioned below:

S. No.	Feedback	Action Taken
1.	To improve students communication skills	University immediately took the action on this valuable feedback and started the five language labs in different departments. Beside this the soft skill courses, oral and written communication and languages like hindi, English, programmes started in different departments. University also conducted different personality development programs in various departments & organized MOOC sessions for the students to prepare them for the interviews. University also organizes different debate & extempore, seminars on different social & scientific topics to improve the communication skills of the students.
2.	The University needs to have more MOUs with industries and academic institutions.	The University appreciated the feedback from employers regarding the MoU's and university immediately took the action on it. University signed 76 MoU's with different

		educational institutions of national and international repute. Business enterprises, cooperates, and industry for improves the skills of the students, to provide more opportunities for their employments and to facilitate them for starting their start-ups & motivate them for entrepreneurship.
3.	The University should include more skill-based courses.	The university has several courses in its course curriculum to cater the students for skill development. The university offers courses of programming, web development, engineering graphics, Auto cad, 3 D printer, machine learning, and financial management, foreign languages like Russian, German and France. Besides this, the programs of life sciences, Master of social works, environmental science and Rural development are facilitating the students to enhance their skills in different streams of science and humanities. The university provides multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary course curriculum though the students of any stream can benefit with different skills.
4	To have more industrial visits and field visits.	University understand the importance of industrial visit for the students to provide the exposure for current scenario of global trends. University facilitated the students with make the provision of industrial visit as the part of course curriculum in the form of field project work and field research work.
