Amendment to The K.M. Institute M.A./MMC Degree Ordinances 2017

7.2 The actual credits requirement for Master's Degree shall be prescribed by the Department concerned

Provided that it shall not be less than 96 credits.

7.2a. A student may be awarded a Post-graduate Diploma in Linguistics if (s)he completes two semesters of the program with a minimum of 48 credits. All other requirements such as CGPA will remain the same as for the award of the master degree.

Provided that the student may be awarded B.A. (Research) if (s)he had opted for the concerned subject as one of the major subjects at the 3-year UG program and successfully completed those and (s)he completes two semesters of the current program with a minimum of 48 credits and a minimum CGPA of 7.5. If the CGPA is less than 7.5, then (s)he will be awarded B.A. (Hons.).

**In the first semester, the students are required to do a major project and submit an intermediate report in partial fulfilment of the requirements for project / internship in the first 2 semesters. However, in the second semester, they may choose to do a summer internship after the end of the semester (or partially overlapping with the semester) OR continue with the major project that they started in the first semester. If they choose to do an internship in the second semester, they will need to submit a report of only the internship; however, if they decide to continue with the project of the first semester, they will need to submit a major, consolidated report based on the work done in both the semesters.
